Unfortunately as the season is winding down our coaches are amping up. There was a hearing last night and one tonight. Let's remind our coaches what is acceptable behavior. What has been said to our young refs is totally unacceptable.

## E. BCLOA Rep Tyler Boyer

Wow, to think the season is winding down is crazy. This is sure going by fast.

We've had a few tough weekends lately getting all the games filled with officials. Our numbers were significantly reduced from tournaments, Jr/Sr games, the amount of Minor games to fill, associations lacking the appropriate amount of officials, and the typical start of summer activities (weddings, commitments, etc).

- This upcoming year, we desperately need Associations to really push for previous officials to return to the sport, or get graduated players / coaches into officiating. Our biggest needs, and those that cause the biggest issues, are in the U15 and above divisions, where we need experienced officials and do not have the manpower to constantly fill that.
- We may also want to re-think the number of times we use neutral site games in locations that do not have an adequate number of officials that are local. This can cause massive strain on being able to fill games, and things becoming very last minute.
- More weekday games would also alleviate some of the weekend pressures for games.

Game reports - we are continuing to drive home that game reports must be completed within 24 hours to all of our officials. It is getting better as the season goes, but there are still a few that go past that desired time limit. We are continuing to push for these to be done ASAP.

RAMP Gamesheets - we are getting better on the official side, having these completed accurately and signed off on - in part, a big thank you to the volunteers (managers, parents, presidents) helping them learn the system. We still have work to be done, so I continue to follow up with all those that are not done correct and pushing the importance of this being done.

Officials continue to travel up and down the Island to try and ensure all Minor games are covered. It can be a test a lot of the time, but the teamwork between Allocators and Head Refs has been great to see. We will need to continue with the teamwork mindset to have our games completed with the numbers we have.

Travel pay is not as big of a topic this year, which is great. There are only a few times where I've heard it mentioned, but as discussed, working towards getting it to a consistent rate across the board in the following seasons will be good.

Lastly, a big thanks to everyone for the massive amounts of time and effort for making this season happen for the kids.

This tournament took place at the end of May and went really well. We used a three-referee system for all games, and it made a noticeable difference. Having that extra ref on the floor helped reduce missed calls and kept the games under better control. We received a lot of positive feedback from coaches and parents about the officiating, which we're really proud of. Based on how well it worked, I'll be recommending to BCLA that tournaments from U11–U17 consider using a three-ref system moving forward to help cut down on referee abuse and issues with parents.

A big factor seemed to be the cost of hotel rooms in Victoria that weekend, which made it tough for some teams to attend. We're already working on blocking hotel rooms for next year to help attract more teams and offer more divisions. This tournament also used the three-ref system, and once again, it worked really well.

#### F. Nanaimo

This season has seen improvement across many areas, and we're proud of the progress made!

#### **Coaching Development**

Our internal Coaching Symposium has made a real difference. We've seen better on-floor instruction, more ideasharing among coaches, and increased collaboration on handling challenges—like navigating difficult parent situations. Based on its success, we plan to make the Coaching Symposium an annual event, improving it each year.

#### **Tournaments and Competition**

Many of our teams attended tournaments throughout the season, and we successfully hosted the Tim White Memorial—thank you to all who helped make it a great event!

Unfortunately, some of our female teams were shortchanged in the interlocking schedule and didn't receive the six games outlined in the original agreement. We're grateful that VELA stepped up to help fill the gap. We've had ongoing discussions around *meaningful competition*, especially when A1 teams face A2 or A vs. B—these matchups can be lopsided and may hurt long-term growth. This is an island-wide topic worth exploring further and could be partly addressed with provincial adoption of MyLax.

#### **Team Highlights**

Our U-11 A team has had a strong season—despite receiving the last pick of floor times and needing to play some 'home games' in Delta. Across the North Island, U-11 competition has been much tighter this year, leading to closer games and better experiences all around.

A recent highlight: the U-11 A team hosted JDF in a "Senior-style" game experience with player announcements, drums in the stands, the national anthem, and a fundraising entry by donation. They're capping off their season by attending a tournament in Calgary, and the energy and excitement around the team have been incredible.

#### **Looking Ahead**

We're now well into planning for the upcoming Female Provincials. We have a fantastic group of parents supporting the effort, and we're excited to showcase a great event on our beautiful island!

## G. Oceanside

Oceanside is thankful for all the teams that participated in our 2 tournaments. Everything went off without a hitch and the support we received was incredible. The ALL STAR game we hosted during intermission at the Jr game was a huge success. We want to thank the coaches that stepped up to organize the littles in the dressing room and for being on the bench with them. A lot of smiles and even more fun!!

May I please ask that we remind our fans a few things,

- -not all our players have signed photo consent waivers for various reasons, so if your fans want to take pictures or furthermore, record our bench for evidence that this is a breach of privacy and the individual could face criminal charges. We have players whose parents are cops and asked me to pass this on.
- -Managers and coaches are responsible for keeping their fans under control. This isn't the pros; there is no need for feuds. We at OMLA have decided if it continues to be a problem, we will not allow fans in our arenas. My fans have all been warned to keep themselves in check because our managers and coaches are volunteers and do not need to be security.
- -U11 is no contact. May we express to the mentors to ensure this is being corrected at the games? I popped into a game in Nanaimo a while ago and was surprised how many cross checks, slashes, tripping etc. were happening and coaches clapping and refs doing nothing. Some even laughed with the players that did it.

There have been a few games where officials are making wrong calls and the consequences of this are detrimental to some players and this can not be corrected. We will not overrule an official's call even with footage, so mentors being scarce and not always available, this should be made important to ensure the call is correct and also to the correct player.

I am stepping down as president in the fall and look forward to walking beside the individual that will step up to take the reigns.

#### H. Peninsula

The season is flying by at light speed but has gone relatively smoothly. We have had a few issues arise along the way that gave us the opportunity to send a reminder to the members of the importance of staying in the right lane as players, parents and fans.

#### B. U9 South

As a brand new commissioner i think u9 has been going fairly smooth. There have been a lot of game changes due to tournaments. We have had to cancel or reschedule two games because of weather. I was able to make it to about eight games at the call of the wild tournament. Was a great tournament ran very smoothly and kids were having a great time. I am looking forward to the Father's Day tournament coming up this weekend. I have not been asked to be the commissioner in charge for that tournament, but I will be around there most of the weekend to watch the kids out there. Other than that the season is winding down just in time for summer.

#### C. U9 North

A couple small issues over the last week. Concerns were brought up regarding the Nanaimo "jamboree" days not having certified refs present. This lead to a reminder that all games need to be scheduled in ramp as exhibition games so that refs could be allocated.... which subsequently lead to the games being canceled. Unfortunate for sure, perhaps a compromise for next year can be found to facilitate more opportunities for play while remaining a safe/fun environment.

This weekend a fan was asked to leave by the refs, and there was some resistance by the fan. Fortunately it was a senior ref who was confident and knew how to handle the situation (didn't restart until the fan left). My big concern is that so many u7/u9/u11 games are reffed by younger officials who might not have the confidence to go up against an adult. Although it is the home teams responsibility, out of sportsmanship and good faith I would like to ask for the coach/manager/parents of visiting teams fans to take responsibility and control them.

Otherwise and excellent year! And as stated by Renee the oceanside tournament went of with zero issues and I was not required to get involved.

Thanks to all of the team managers as well as the ref and floor allocators and Stephanie for their work rescheduling games.

There were some comments about the competitive gap between A1 and A2 and there were scores that reflected that. I think that association presidents should consider fewer regular season games. It would give A1 and A2 an opportunity to play more tournaments or exhibition games at their level rather than spend half their season playing teams above or below their declared tier.

## G. U13 B/C

After taking over in early May, this biggest hurdle was getting some games rescheduled that hadn't been done. Other than that the transition went smoothly

I am getting all kinds of complaints due to the unbalanced schedule and the final standings. I have directed all complaints back to the associations. Whether they get to the presidents I don't know

I would ask all the presidents to consider a reduced number of games for the regular season next year


