Not a lot to report. I ran a level 1 coaching clinic in Oceanside on Saturday and we may try and have one more in April.

E. BCLOA Rep Tyler Boyer

The other week I met with a majority of Association Head Officials and Allocators for our pre-season meeting. All associations seem to have Head Official coverage which is great. Everyone seems to have a good grasp on where things are currently at for officials and upcoming items.

In-class clinics on the Island will be running the next two weekends. Currently, numbers seem to be quite good for Entry Level and Level 1. Numbers around Level 2 are concerning, however, there has been a good influx of Level 2's being upgraded into the Level 3 clinics. If associations are able to do any additional recruiting - graduating Jr players, parents, etc. - that would be great. Sometimes we are able to expedite those who have lots of experience in lacrosse much quicker than younger kids.

The on-floor portion of the clinic is currently being scheduled and will be running similar to previous seasons with the inclusion of Level 2's also doing an on-floor session.

The BCLA / Official's Group is utilizing RAMP registrations for clinics. It has had some headaches, but it is mostly a positive change and is a much better process than previous years.

F. Indigenous Development Coordinator Bryan Baxter

I ran an MCD and a CPI this past weekend. CMD had 25 coaches and CPI had 16. Great weekend of coach training.

G. Female Coordinator Shane Mellish

We have a new two year agreement for interlocked games with the Lower mainland. (Thanks John, Sandra and Tim)

The interlocked games will get a little more complicated this season as there will be teams from the interior involved in travel games.

The details for how this will work out are still being discussed.

Prepare your teams; it may mean more travel or possibly further distance.

The scheduler has been given some templates for female game options depending on the number of teams declared tonight.

John (Female Director) has mapped out all the possible days for interlocked games and they have been passed on to the scheduler.

I will send our declared female teams our scheduler as well as the lower mainland scheduler tonight for them to start to develop the schedules.

I believe both Victoria and Nanaimo have provided their floor time to the Scheduler.

With more teams, further distances, more tournaments, and a shorter season our games will be difficult to complete.

Please start now to prepare your Coaches and parents that the season will be intense and logistically difficult.

Last year we had to send games back to associations to schedule themselves - we will be doing so again if necessary.

Weeknight game slots are mandatory - there are weeknight game options for all associations, and all associations are required to send options. In addition to floor time, I will be asking for association blackout dates (association wide requests - tournament association host weekend, association fundraiser or photo day, for example) ASAP. I will send these requests to both presidents and floor allocators who I am aware of.
