## A Return to Ringette!

We started the season with a very busy month in September with tryouts for all Provincial teams. All our Regional and Provincial teams were finally confirmed in October and after a few stops and starts with Covid concerns we returned to a condensed season. It certainly felt like a return to normal by the end of the 2021-2022 season!

Although teams were not able to participate in as many league games and tournaments, they were able to participate in Regional and Provincial events in March and April and one of our U 19 AA teams travelled to Calgary to compete in the Canadian National Ringette Championships. We look forward to our continued relationship with Kitchener Ringette and other ringette associations in our region as we grow our sport in our communities.

Waterloo Ringette has been a successful community sport organization for over 50 years and it is because of a dedicated volunteer base.
