2020 Water Polo Canada (WPC) Age Group National Team (AGNT) programs (November 22, 2019)

<u>IMPORTANT</u>: Changes or adjustments to specific programming details as listed in this document may still be required (dependent on exact travel dates, UANA or FINA changes, etc.). Further updates to this document will occur and WPC will communicate them via email to the WPC membership. They will also be posted on the WPC website.

1. INTRODUCTION

The goal of this document is to provide guidance to all WPC stakeholders with regards to AGNT programs for 2019-20 selection processes and timelines. A preliminary assessment of the fees for participation will be provided in a program update in February 2020 once we have received confirmation of our high performance budgets in late January 2020.

2. REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRES

In order to better identify, test, and evaluate athletes for team selection, WPC has established Regional Development Center (RDC) programs across the country that are **mandatory** for any athlete who wishes to eligible for an AGNT in the summer of 2020. Athletes living in regions without an RDC program will have the opportunity to participate in Regional Development Camp(s). See section 7.

An athlete living within the region of an RDC who was unable to participate in the program can request from WPC a special exemption providing detailed information regarding their inability to attend an RDC program (See Appendix 1). Any special exemption request must be made before **February 1st, 2020** to the High Performance Director (HPD) (joliveira@waterpolo.ca).

3. ATHLETE EVALUATION & IDENTIFICATION TOOLS

WPC will be delivering tools to guide and enhance the selection process of the age group national teams to all RDCs and Provincial Sport Organizations (PSOs). All athlete and team evaluations are to be completed using the WPC document, and <u>other forms of evaluations will not be accepted</u>. RDCs are required to submit this tool for any athlete to be evaluated as part of the AGNT program. Note that Clubs and PSOs can submitted evaluation forms in support of athletes requesting a special exemption for their inability to attend an RDC program.

4. STAFF STRUCTURE AGE GROUP PROGRAMS

All AGNT programs will be centrally managed by WPC. Overall program direction and oversight will come from the WPC High Performance Director (HPD) coming from select Senior National Team Coaches.

Coordination and management of the AGNT programs will be the responsibility of the WPC HPD or designates in coordination with the Senior National Team Manager whereas technical coordination, including the preparation of the Age Group YTP and technical preparation program will be assigned to the Senior National Team Coaching Staff.

The daily implementation of these programs will then be assigned to an age group staffing structure comprised of part time AGNT Head Coach (HC), Assistant Coach (AC) and Team Manager (TM) appointed by WPC. These contracts will be part time contracts.

WPC may name additional resources in the roles of Head Scout, Mentor Coach or medical personnel. The main objectives associated to these positions are to support the overall identification, evaluation and performance of WPC's AGNT Programs. In the spirit of Professional Development and aligned with its Coaching and Technical Leadership (CTL) development strategy supported by WPC high performance partners, WPC has assigned key positions for its current Senior National Team Staff.

7. ATHLETE SELECTION PROCESSS

7.1 Athlete selection timeline

- a. NCL scouting according to full NCL calendar.
- b. RDC identifies long list of athletes by February 1st
- c. RDC depth charts to be submitted to PSOs no later than April 1st annually.
- PSO's depth charts to be submitted to WPC's HPD (joliveira@waterpolo.ca) no later than April 15th annually.
- e. **NCAA or international athletes** are responsible to coordinate with the PSO of their registered Club Team to ensure they are present on a depth chart and their willingness to participate in the AGNTs.

7.2 Athlete Selection guidelines

In order to be eligible for AGNT programs, an athlete must:

- a. Be an active member in good standing with Water Polo Canada.
- b. Be a Canadian citizen.
- c. Hold a valid Canadian passport valid for a <u>minimum of 6 months beyond the international</u> <u>competitive dates</u> for each AGNT program.
- d. Sign the WPC Athlete Agreement and Code of Conduct.
- e. Participate with their local Regional Development Centre, participated in all Regional Development Camp(s) in their local region or has an approved exemption from WPC.
- f. If currently residing and training full-time in Canada participate in the NCL or MLWP.
 - a. NCAA and international athletes must follow the guidelines in section 7.1. e.

7.3 Scouting and depth charts

The primary source of scouting information will be from the Regional Development Centres, Regional Development Camps and the National Championship League (NCL). Depth charts will be required according the submission deadline as explained in section 6. All depth charts must be submitted to the HPD and <u>must be in the WPC format only.</u>

NCAA scouting reports or video highlight reels will also be considered where applicable and must be provided by the NCAA athlete, RDC Coach or Canadian Club Head Coach.

7.4 Final selection of teams

The final selection of the team will remain the responsibility of WPC. The appointed NT age group head coach will submit final nomination to WPC for final approval on the basis of:

- Athlete's previous and current performance
- Technical Ability
- Tactical Ability
- Physical Ability
- Mental Ability
- Demonstrated commitment to a lifestyle conducive to the training and preparation for, and playing of, international water polo

- Demonstrated ability to play within a team environment,
- Positional requirements (both starters and reserves),
- Competition requirements (i.e. opponents, location, etc.),
- Team dynamics, team cohesiveness
- Attitude

8. AGNT SUPPORT STAFF RESPONSIBILITIES

Each AGNT staff will be composed of a head coach, assistant coach and a team manager. WPC intends to enter into a contractual relationship with each of the selected staff members on the basis of the following time assessment for each position over the course of a calendar year running from April 1st to October 31st annually.

The intent of WPC will be to ensure continuity on a minimum 2-year window aligned with the international requirements. Two-year contractual will be issued for the men and women's 19U AGNT. Furthermore, WPC will consider continuity over a full 4-year period commencing with the 19U staff but will issue contracts on a 2-year basis. Contracts will be subject to OTP and partner funding and will require annual confirmation of funds.

9. ASSESSMENT OF FEES

The AGNT player fees will be determined by the end of February 2020 after confirmation from OTP and Sport Canada of the Water Polo Canada's 2019/20 budget.
