Hockey coaches seeking certification participate in clinics within National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) instruction streams that are relative to the level of players they are coaching. Coaches training within the Community Sport Stream do not require NCCP certification. They maintain a Trained status.

### **COMMUNITY SPORT**

Coach 1 – Intro to Coaching

Coach 2 – Coach Level

## **COMPETITION INTRODUCTION**

Development 1 & 2

At this level, you're typically a hockey coach with previous experience, or maybe a former athlete. Perhaps you already coach a hockey team and you want to work with athletes' long term to improve their performance.

# **COMPETITION DEVELOPMENT**

High Performance 1 & 2

At this level, you're typically a hockey coach with previous experience, or maybe a former athlete. Perhaps you already coach a hockey team and you want to work with athletes' long term to improve their performance.

### **INSTRUTIONAL STREAM**

Instructors in this stream are required to have sport-specific skills and training, whether at the beginner or advanced skill level. Many are former hockey players.
