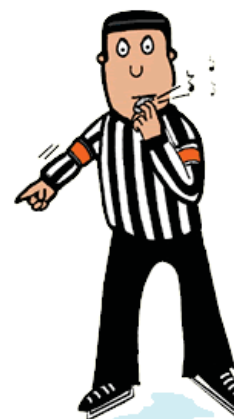

The Ontario Women's Hockey Association extends its most sincere congratulations and thanks to our teammates throughout Ontario who work tirelessly to provide opportunities for players of all ages and skill levels to enjoy female hockey and to gain positive life skills and experiences.

We thank Premier Wynne, Minister Couteau and the staff in the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport for their recognition of the OWHa as the Provincial Sports Organization (PSO) for Female Hockey in the Province of Ontario. We are thrilled with the release of Game ON – the Ontario Government's Sports Plan and look forward to its positive impact on hockey and sport in this province. We enjoy a strong relationship with other PSO members and support our members to be multi-sport athletes which will enhance their athleticism and life experiences.

Game ON – The Ontario Government's Sport Plan is a sport-focussed, athlete-centred and results-oriented plan. The plan builds on a strong existing foundation of sport organizations, programs and investments. It recognizes the many ways in which organized sport can be good for people and communities, from the obvious health benefits of physical activity to the economic benefits of major events.

The plan has identified three priorities for amateur sport in this province – participation, development and excellence. The plan is designed to support a system that encourages as many people as possible to play organized sports, and to retain participants in those sports by developing the passion and skills of the athletes. The Ontario Government's Sport Plan encourages life-long participation and engagement in sport and physical activity.

Participation:

All athletes are better able to participate in safe, organized sport.

Opportunities are available for all Ontarians to get involved in organized sport.

Athletes participating in organized sport are provided with a positive experience.

OWHA teams and association welcome girls and women of all ages and abilities. Registration numbers need to rise and we are encouraging each member to meet and exceed the challenge issued by Hockey Canada President, Tom Renney, to reach one million (1,000,000) participants by 2020. This means that all members in Hockey Canada will need to increase registration by 40%, including OWHa.

The OWHa offers a welcoming environment to all communities. As examples, some OWHa associations have developed brochures in Mandarin to encourage the Chinese communities while others have worked with local mosques to encourage young Muslim girls to play hockey. Many associations are working hard to address the costs of hockey and to find ways to accommodate children in low income families, recognizing the challenges of sustainability. The aboriginal community has always had a strong presence and Team Ontario successfully captured the silver medals at the National Aboriginal Championship in Mississauga this May.

Safety is a priority in the OWHa with its PAWSitive Values, the driving force towards rewarding on and off-ice experiences that support the physical development and emotional health of each and every person.

The OWHa will continue to expand its success in achieving the Government's objective to narrow the gender gap in sport participation. The OWHa's 100% focus on Female Hockey is a proven structural model in the sports world.

A global survey of 400 women executives found that 94 per cent participated in sport and 74 per cent agreed that a background in sport can help accelerate a woman's leadership and career potential.

Development:

Athletes receive the right support as their skills develop.

Athletes have access to trained coaches, officials and volunteers as they progress through the development pathway overseen by effective PSO.

Players throughout the province are developing team and individual skills as the calibre of the game continues to increase as teams came together to compete and celebrate the scope of Female Hockey at the OWHA Provincial Championships. In addition to the competitive side of the game, house leagues continue to grow and provide opportunities for players learning the game as they strive to move onto higher level teams and also for athletes who prefer this level of participation.

A focus on a welcoming environment continues as a priority of the OWHA. Coaches and team staff are key players in skill development, team play and fair play. Many players, teams and games continue to be aware and support for Do It For Daron (DIFD) and mental health awareness. Studies continue to demonstrate that fun is a key component for athletes at even the highest level of sport.

The OWHA officiating program continues to thrive under the exceptional leadership of OWHA Referee-in-Chief, Laurie Taylor Bolton, and a professional team of instructors and supervisors. The OWHA held multiple certification clinics, specialty seminars including scheduling and supervising the PWHL, OUA, CWHL OWHA Provincial Championships and Under 18 National Championships.

The OWHA was disappointed with the cancellation of the 2015 Ontario Winter Games but is thrilled to be a part of the 2016 Ontario Summer Games that will be held August 11-14 in Mississauga. This is a great opportunity to run development programs for our Under 16 players, as well as participating coaches, team staff and on-ice officials. It is an exciting chance for participants to share a multi-sport Games with other sports.

Athletic financial awards for Canadian Interuniversity Sport athletes totaled \$7.4 million for men compared to \$5.3 million for women in 2013.

Excellence:

Athletes can pursue excellence in high-performance sport.

Athletes have competitive training and development opportunities, access to the latest high-performance programs, services, facilities and technologies and we are led by quality coaches, technical leaders and sport science and medicine experts.

The OWHA had an incredibly successful season at the High Performance Level sending 4 teams to 3 National Championships, bringing home 2 gold, 1 silver and 1 bronze medals. Team Ontario Red won the gold medals at the U18 National Women's Hockey Championship with Team Ontario Blue taking the bronze medals.

At the 2016 Esso Cup, National Female Midget Championship, Brantford exhibited an outstanding performance, both on and off the ice, capturing gold medals against very tough competition. We also congratulate Team Ontario on its silver medal performance at the 2016 National Aboriginal Championship in Mississauga.

Hockey Canada came away with 3 silver medals in International competition. The OWHA placed 11 players on the National U18 team, 11 on the National Women's Team at the Four Nations Cup and 9 on the National Women's Team at the World Championship. We congratulate all teams on their performance.

Opportunities continue to grow in the OUA/CIS with more young players considering the strength of both the academic and hockey programs. We congratulate the University of Guelph on capturing the OUA Championship.

The CWHL Clarkson Cup championship was captured by Calgary Inferno in an exciting game in Ottawa against Montreal Stars in front of many OWHA supporters. We congratulate the winners and also commend Brampton Thunder, Toronto Furies and Boston Blades on a great season.

With the support of the Ministry, the OWHA carded 22 Ontario Athletes through Quest for Gold.

A highlight of the season for the OWHA was the hosting of the 2016 National U18 Championship in Huntsville and the 2016 IIHF U18 World Women's Hockey Championship in St. Catharines. We sincerely thank the host committees and communities who did an outstanding job taking both events to new levels.

Of the 108 Canadian coaches at the 2014 Winter Olympics, only 11 were women.

In addition to the many activities of the 2015-2016 season, the OWHA reflected on its big-picture success over the past several seasons as we worked to increase our positioning in the hockey and sports world. Within the province of Ontario, the OWHA successfully completed the Ontario HPMP (High Performance Management Program) which qualified the organization to apply for acceptance into OHPSI (Ontario High Performance Sport Initiative). Upon acceptance into the program, we now work directly with CSIO (Canadian Sport Institute Ontario) and partner more closely with Hockey Canada in alignment with the delivery of high performance education, programs and training.

The Ontario Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport is launching an updated Sport Recreation Policy in the spring of 2016. We have attended a number of meetings and a provincial symposium listening to updated government requirements. We have secured the services of both governance and strategic planning experts as we review our management in order to better align with Ministry standards, Hockey Canada and to be at the top level of PSO's in Ontario. The OWHA is working on a new governance structure, increased operational staff and an updated strategic plan. We are also undertaking a full review of rules, regulations and policies. We thank our consultant, Barbara Lyon-Stewart for her support in this endeavour.

The OWHA offers a wide range of programs and provides both participation and competition. It is absolutely critical that every single person takes responsibility and is accountable for upholding the positive values of the OWHA. Perspective is critical – hockey is a Game. Each time a player, volunteer, official, parent or supporter goes to a game or practice, they deserve a welcoming environment as we are all teammates in both hockey and in life. A special moment that puts this into perspective came this year for Brantford Ice Cats as they neared the end of the round robin at the Esso Cup when Makenna Ryder was cleared by Sick Kids Hospital to make the flight to Weyburn to cheer on her teammates. Makenna had been a valuable player and leader on the team until shortly before the OWHA Provincials when she was diagnosed with a very serious heart problem. We wish her well in the future and extend our congratulations on her inspirational support.

In closing, we would like to end by extending our most heartfelt appreciation for the contributions and friendship of Doug Nicholls who passed away last spring. Doug was a recruit to female hockey from ringette when his daughter Leisa switched sports. Doug was a key volunteer in the OWHA serving many roles and always putting the player first. We thank him for his outstanding contributions and commitment to each and every player.

Ontario Women's Hockey Association

The Ontario Women's Hockey Association (OWHA) had a vision to develop female hockey to the highest level. In 1982 they hosted the first National Championship and lobbied for acceptance in the Winter Olympics. In 1987 the OWHA hosted the First Women's World Hockey Tournament. The OWHA had a goal to place Ontario athletes on national teams and to develop athletes who are exceptional role models for Ontarians. Membership (players and coaches) has grown from 4,900 in 1987 to 58,499 in 2015.

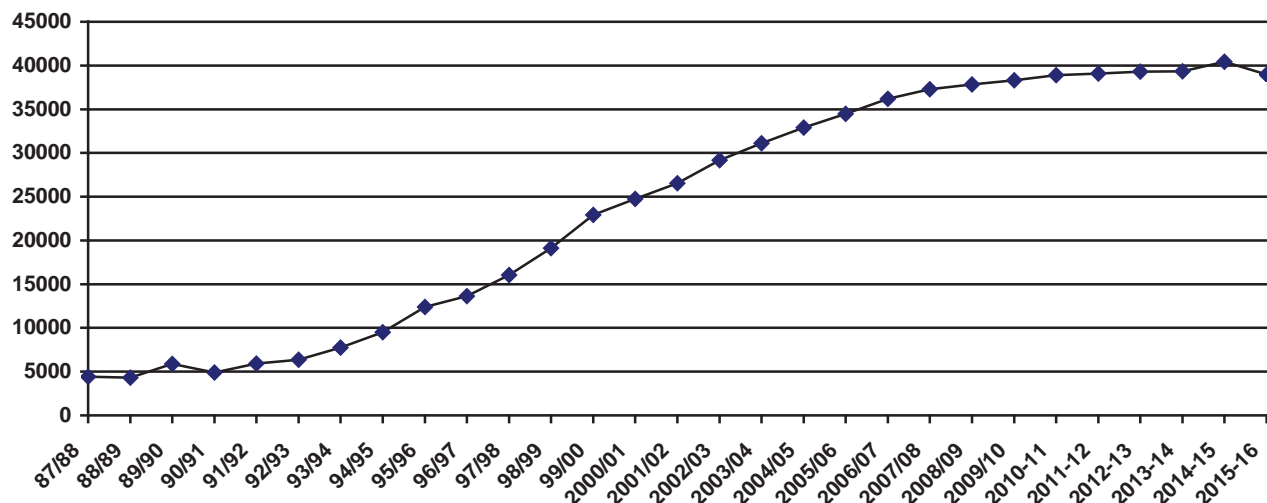

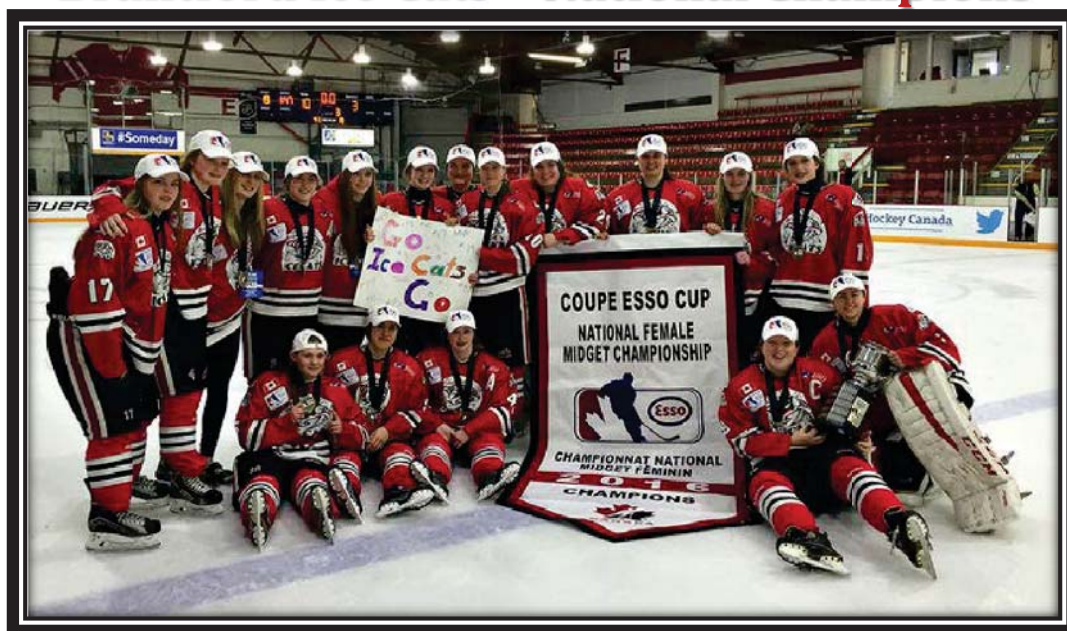

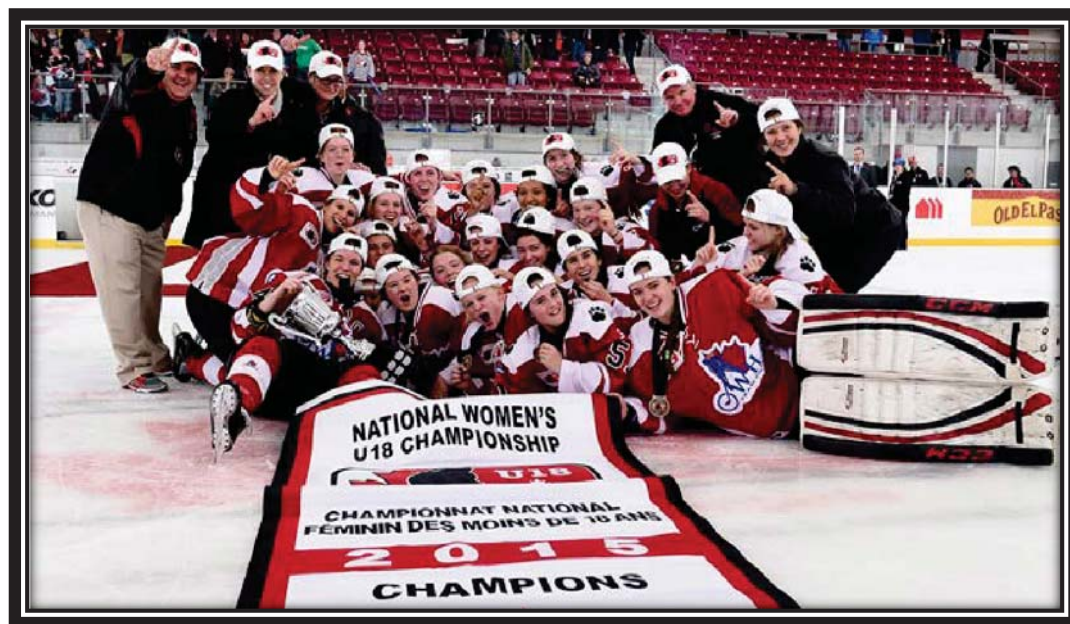

Discipline Report : 2015-2016



Novice

There were a total of 9 suspensions at the Novice Level. The Novice A level had 3; there were 4 at the Novice B level and 2 at the House League level. Of these 9 suspensions, 6 were issued to Coaching staff.

Atom

There were 49 suspensions at the Atom Level. This is a slight increase in the number of suspensions called last year. The Atom B level received the most suspensions with 15, which represents 31% of the Atom suspensions. This was followed closely by the Atom A level which received 10 suspensions. Checking from behind (GM50) was the most frequently called suspension with 11 or 22% of all Atom suspensions. The next highest suspension, disputing a call, accounted for 10 or 20% of the total suspensions. Coaches received 21 of the 49 suspensions at the Atom level which represents 42% of all Atom level suspensions. Coaches at the Atom B level received the most suspensions with 10 or 20%.

Peewee

There were 119 suspensions at the Peewee level. This number is down from the previous season and represents a 23% decrease in the number of suspensions compared to last season. The Peewee AA and Peewee B level received the most suspensions with 12 each or 20% combined of all Peewee suspensions. The next highest was the Peewee BB level with 10 suspensions. Disputing a Call was the highest called suspension with 29 or 24% of all Peewee suspensions. The Peewee A and BB levels both received the most of these suspensions with, Peewee A at 7 or 24% and Peewee BB at 8 or 28%. This was followed closely by the Peewee AA level with 6. Checking from Behind (GM50) was the next highest suspension called with 18 or 15%. The Peewee A level received the most of these suspensions with 8. Coaches received 47 or 39% of all suspensions at the Peewee level. Coaches at the Peewee BB level received the most suspensions with 13 or 11% of all Coaching suspensions.

Bantam

There were 341 suspensions at the Bantam level. This represents a 13% increase in the number of suspensions received last year. The Bantam AA level received the most with 23 suspensions or 7% of all Bantam suspensions. The suspension called most often was Checking from Behind (GM50) with 65 suspensions or 20%. The Bantam A level received the most of these types of suspensions with 27, followed by the Bantam AA level with 13. The next highest suspension called was Disputing a Call with 47 suspensions. This number remains the same as last season. The Bantam A level received the most of these types of suspensions with 21. Coaches received 80 or 23% of all suspensions at the Bantam level. The Bantam A level coaches received the most suspensions with 31 or 9% of all coaching suspensions at this level. Players at this level received 90 or 26% of the suspensions in Bantam.

Midget

There were 509 suspensions at the Midget level. This represents a 10% decrease in the number of suspensions received last year. The Midget A and AA levels received the highest number of suspensions with 129 and 97 respectively which represents 25% and 20% of all Midget suspensions. Checking from Behind (GM50) was the suspension called most often with 90 or 18% of all Midget suspensions. The Midget A and BB levels received the most of these types of suspensions with 24 and 21 suspensions. The next highest suspension called was Disputing a Call (GM20) with 51 suspensions or 10%. The Midget A level received the most of these suspensions with 16. Coaches received 96 or 19% of all suspensions at the Midget level. The levels where the coaches received the most suspensions were Midget A with 30 (6%), Midget AA with 21 (4%) and Midget B with 20 (4%).

Intermediate

The Intermediate Level received 123 suspensions. This represents a 9% decrease in the number of suspensions received last year. The Intermediate AA level received the most suspensions with 47 or 38% of all Intermediate suspensions. The Intermediate House League level received the next highest number of suspensions with 44 or 36%. Checking from Behind (GM50) was called most often at the Intermediate level with 20 or 16%. The Intermediate AA level received the most of these types of suspensions with 16 or 13% of all Checking from Behind suspensions. The next highest suspension called was Abusive Language (GM21) with 14 or 11%.

Senior

There were 86 Senior level suspensions. This represents a 23% decrease from last year. The Senior AA and Senior House League level received the most suspensions with 16 each. While the suspensions were spread out amongst a number of types, Head Checking (GM71/72) and Abusive Language (GM21) were called most with 12 GM71/72's and 10 GM21's. Coaches received 12 suspensions in this category, with the Senior A level Coaches receiving the most with 6.

Referees

There were over 550 referees identified as having called the suspension penalties this year. These were spread out fairly evenly amongst all the referees.

Overall

Overall this year there were 1236 suspensions called. This represents a 4% decrease over last year where 1282 suspensions were called.

The suspension called most often was Checking from Behind (GM50) with 214, which represents 17% of all suspensions called. The Midget level received the most Checking from Behind suspensions with 90 or 42% of these types of suspensions. The next highest suspension called was Disputing a Call with 162 or 13%. The Midget Level also received the most of these types of suspensions with 51 or 31%. The Bantam Level was close behind with 47 or 29%.

Again this year, the Midget category received the highest number of suspensions with 509 of the 1236 or 41% of all suspensions. The next highest category receiving suspensions was Bantam with 341 suspensions or 28%. The Midget A level again received the highest number of suspensions with 30 or 3% of all suspensions. This was followed closely by the Midget AA and BB level with 24 suspensions each.

Coaching staff received 278 or 22% of all suspensions. The Midget level coaches again received the most with 96 or 35% of all Coach suspensions. Coaches at the Bantam level were next highest with 80 suspensions.

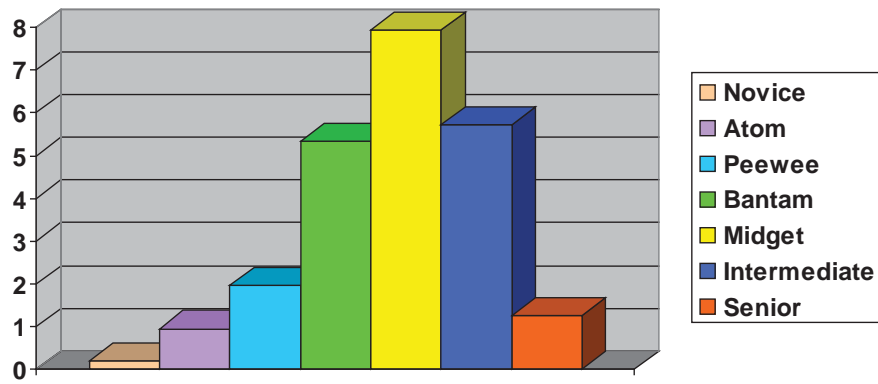

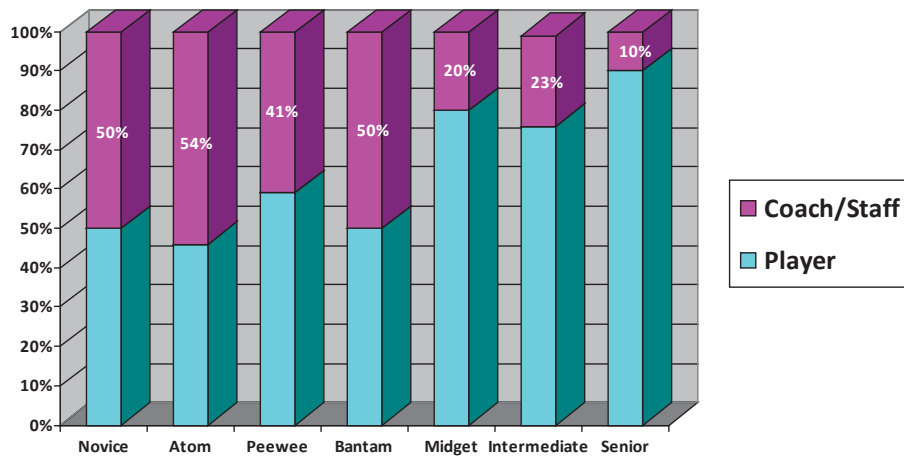
2014 -2015 SUSPENSIONS BY DIVISION

Suspensions by Division Based on Total Player Registration

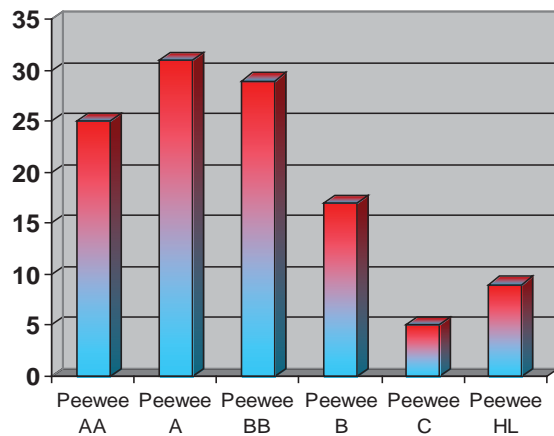


**percentage of suspensions based on total registration numbers for each division for the 2014-2015 season.*

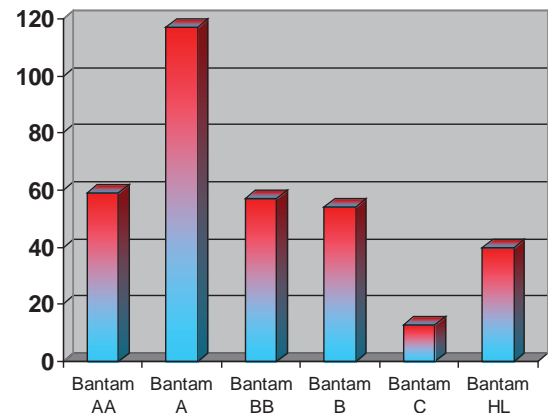
Percentage of Suspensions to Coaches and Players by Division



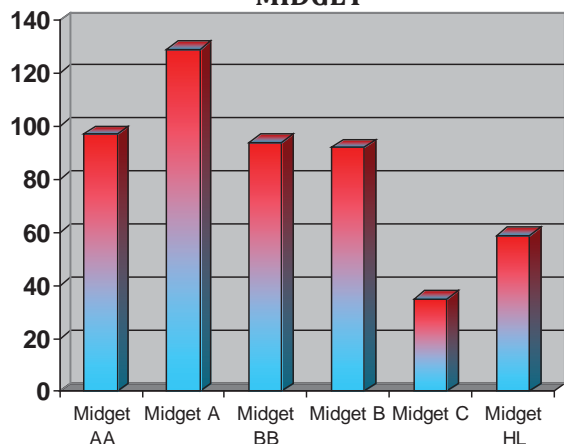

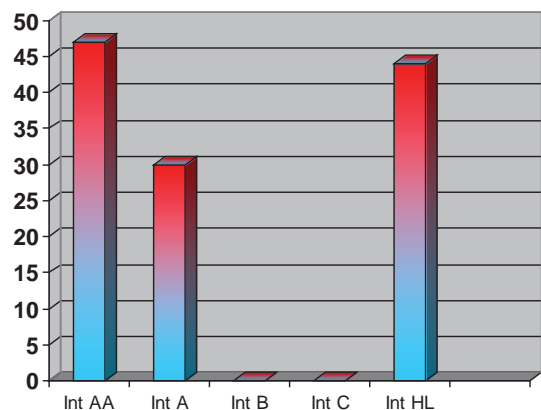

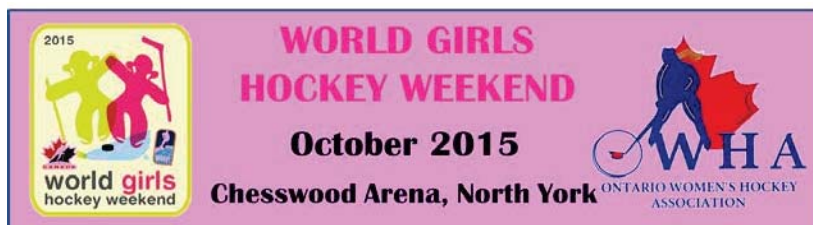

LONG GAME INITIATIVE

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 10, 2015



Objective: The 2015 World Girls' Hockey Weekend was a huge success, with the OWHA and Canada leading the way in shaping the future of female hockey. The OWHA takes pride in being a leader in female hockey and plans to continue that tradition with many special events in Ontario.

- The Long Game is the feature event of the WGHW. This will be one continuous game that includes all provinces in succession from coast to coast starting in Newfoundland & Labrador. There will be five age groups participating, including Atom, Peewee, Bantam, Midget and Senior.
- This event will include over 40 games coast to coast which will involve over 2000 players, 150 coaches and hundreds of volunteers.
- Throughout the day, the scores from each participating game will be recorded and accumulate as we move from province to province with each age category being treated as its own Long Game with 4 running score clocks.

The Long Game Initiative, which featured four of the longest-running female games ever running from the east to west coast. In total, more than 2000 players on 98 teams played in 55 games across the country, which will run continuously at the Atom, Peewee, Bantam, Midget and Senior levels. The first puck drop was at 9:30 a.m. NT in N.L., and the final face-off was at 7 p.m. PT in, B.C. There were over 250 officials running the games, with countless other coaches and volunteers involved across the country.

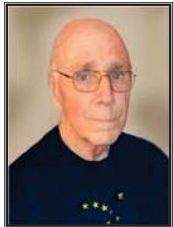
Tracy Diane Chappell

Alyssa Burke Richardson

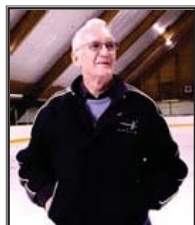
