# CONGRATULATIONS JAYNA HEFFORD on your induction into *The Hockey Hall of Fame*



Jayna Hefford is one of Canada's most decorated women's hockey player. She represented Canada on the game's highest stages for close to 20 years. Jayna was born in Trenton, Ontario on May 14, 1977. She loved hockey and began skating at age six. In 1994 she was a member of Ontario's Championship team in the inaugural women's U-18 tournament. One year later she became a member of Team Ontario at the Canada Winter Games, where she captained her team to a Gold medal win.

She made her world championship debut in 1997, and has been the longest serving member of Canada's National Women's Team. She has won 7 gold medals, and 5 silver medals and has made 12 world championship appearances.

Jayna is a super star both on & off the ice. She continues to have a powerful impact on people as a female hockey role model and in life.

Congratulations Jayna on a well-deserved induction into the Hockey Hall of Fame.

Teams were well matched and both the spectator attendance and the televised games were increasing. The All Star game and Clarkson Cup final were well attended and received. Many young players enjoyed watching their role models.

We congratulate Team Canada U18 on winning gold medals at the IIHF U18 World Championship in Japan. The OWHA placed 12 players on the team and Maddi Wheeler scored the winning goal to clinch the championship. We also congratulate the National Women's Team as it won the Rivalry Series against the USA and captured the bronze medals at the World Championship in Finland. They had hoped for gold but faced strong opposition from Finland and their goalie Noora Rati in a close semi-final. We are proud of all players for representing Canada and the OWHA with excellence.

At the National Level, we hosted the 2019 Esso Cup, National Midget Female Hockey Championship in cooperation with the Sudbury and District Women's Hockey Association and the Sudbury Lady Wolves. The event was an incredible success thanks to the leadership team of Cora Bibij, Mike McGaughey and Pat Murphy, many dedicated volunteers and the Town of Sudbury. We also congratulate our OWHA U18 team that finished fourth at Canada Winter Games. They played well and represented us with excellence both on and off the ice.

We were surprised to receive an invitation from the Japanese Ice Hockey Federation to send a U16 team to Japan in support of their efforts of building the female hockey program. In about a month, we put a team together for, as they put it, a trip of a life time. We sincerely thank the JIHF for providing this international experience and we thank the OWHA club teams for their support of this opportunity for the players.

The Global Game was, once again, an overwhelming success and is another example of Female Hockey uniting the world in teamwork, building on positive values and cooperation. We thank Hockey Canada and Hockey Alberta for hosting the Canada segment and welcoming our six OWHA players.

The past is behind us and we are thankful for the many players and supporters who have given us a sound base of positive values and putting players first. The current season is coming quickly and will feature new initiatives at the pre-novice and novice levels that have been driven by Hockey Canada based on research. **DISCIPLINE REPORT: 2018-2019** 



#### **NOVICE**

There was a total of 12 suspensions issued at the Novice Level. Novice A had 2, Novice B had 7, Novice C had 1 and Novice HL had 2. Of the 12 suspensions issued in the Novice division, 11 were issued to Coaching staff.

#### **ATOM**

There were 61 suspensions at the Atom Level. This is an increase in the number of suspensions from last year. The Atom BB level received the most suspensions with 14, which represents 23% of the Atom suspensions. This was followed closely by Atom AA, A, B and C levels, where 13 suspensions were issued in each category. Disputing officials call (GM20) was the most frequently called suspension with 21 or 34% of all Atom suspensions. The next highest suspension, disputing a call with an Official (GM21-verbal abuse of an official), accounted for 7 or 11% of the total suspensions. Coaches received 39 of the 61 suspensions at the Atom level which represents 64% of all Atom level suspensions. Coaches at the Atom BB level received the most suspensions with 10 or 16%, while coaches in both the Atom A and B levels were close behind, receiving 9 or 15% of the suspensions in each division.

#### **PEEWEE**

There were 134 suspensions at the Peewee level. This number has increased from the previous season. The Peewee BB division received the most suspensions at 35 or 26%. Peewee B was the next highest with 31 or 23% of the total suspensions issued. Peewee A was at 28, while Peewee AA was at 23. Peewee House League had 12 suspensions or 9%, while Peewee C had 3 or 3% of the total suspensions. Checking from Behind (GM55) was the highest suspension called with 31 or 23%. Peewee AA and B received the most (GM55) calls, with 8 each or 6% of the total calls issued. Disputing officials call (GM20) was the next highest suspension called with 12 or 9%. Coaches received 51 or 38% of all suspensions at the Peewee level. The coaches at the Peewee BB and B levels received the most suspensions with Peewee BB at 16 or 12%, and Peewee B at 14 or 10% of all coaching suspensions.

#### **BANTAM**

There were 329 suspensions at the Bantam level. This represents a 6% increase in the number of suspensions received last year. The Bantam A level received the most with 92 suspensions or 28% of all Bantam suspensions. The suspension called most often was Checking from Behind (GM55) with 66 suspensions or 20%. The Bantam A level received the most of these types of suspensions with 25, followed by the Bantam AA level with 14. The next highest suspension called was Disputing officials call (GM20) with 41 suspensions. The Bantam AA level received the most of these types of suspensions with 9. Coaches received 66 or 20% of all suspensions at the Bantam B level. The Bantam B level coaches received the most suspensions with 16 or 5% of all coaching suspensions at this level. Players in the Bantam level received 263 or 80% of the suspensions issued.

#### **MIDGET**

There were 592 suspensions at the Midget level. This represents a 6% increase in the number of suspensions received last year. The Midget BB and B levels received the highest number of suspensions with 144 and 118 respectively which represents 24% and 19% of all Midget suspensions. Checking from Behind (GM55) was the suspension called most often with 106 or 18% of all Midget suspensions. The Midget AA and A levels received the most of these types of suspensions with 30 and 31 suspensions. The next highest suspension called was Body Checking (GM41.11) with 59 suspensions or 10%. The Midget BB level received the most of these suspensions with 14. Coaches received 115 or 20% of all suspensions at the Midget level. The levels where the coaches received the most suspensions were Midget BB at 33 and Midget B with 32, Midget HL with 17 or 2.8% and Midget A with 18 or 3%.

#### **INTERMEDIATE**

The Intermediate Level received 131 suspensions. This represents a 5% increase in the number of suspensions received this year. The Intermediate AA level received the most suspensions with 76 or 58% of all Intermediate suspensions. The Intermediate HL level received the next highest number of suspensions with 28 or 21%. Checking from Behind (GM55) was called most often at the Intermediate level with 20 or 15%. The Intermediate AA level received the most of suspensions with 15 or 11% of all Checking from Behind suspensions. The next highest suspension called was Head Contact (GM41.13) with 13 or 10%.

#### **SENIOR**

There were 71 Senior level suspensions. The Senior A and Senior B levels received the most suspensions with 20 for Senior A and 26 for Senior B. While the suspensions were spread out amongst a number of types, checking from behind (GM21) was called 8 times. Coaches received 4 suspensions, with the Senior B level Coaches receiving the most with 3.

Overall this year there were 1330 suspensions called. This represents an 3% increase over last year where 1262 suspensions were called.

The suspension called most often was Checking from Behind (GM55) with 237 which represents 18% of all suspensions called. The Midget level received the most Checking from Behind suspensions with 106 or 45% of these types of suspensions. The next highest suspension called was Disputing a Call (GM20) with 142 or 11%. Both the Bantam and Midget Levels received the most GM20 suspension calls with 41 in the Bantam division and 43 in the Midget division. Together these two divisions total 84 or 6% of the suspensions for this season.

Again this year, the Midget category received the highest number of suspensions with 592 of the 1330 or 45% of all suspensions. The next highest category receiving suspensions was Bantam with 329 suspensions or 25%. The Midget BB level received the highest number of suspensions with 144 or 11% of all suspensions. This was followed closely by the Midget AA, A and B level with 102 at the AA level, 117 at the A level and 118 at the B level.

Coaching staff received 295 or 22% of all suspensions. The Midget level coaches again received the most with 115 or 39% of all Coach suspensions. Coaches at the Bantam level were next highest with 66 or 21% of the suspensions.

#### This year there were 84 repeat offenders for the season. There were 21 staff members and 63 players who were repeat offenders.


