CONGRATULATIONS HAYLEY WICKENHEISER

on your induction into The Hockey Hall of Fame (2019)



Hayley Wickenheiser is one of Canada's most extraordinary hockey players. As a member of Canada's National Women's Team, she was the most dominant skater over the course of her 23-year career.

Hayley was born on August 12, 1978. She started playing hockey in her hometown of Shaunavon, Saskatchewan when she was five years old. When she was 15 years old, she was selected for Canada's National Women's Team, and played in the 1994 World Championship where she joined her teammates in celebrating a gold medal win. Hayley played in 13 world championships and won seven gold medals, and three silver medals. In 1998 Women's Hockey was introduced to the Winter Olympic Games, here Hayley was named to the inaugural team and took the silver medal.

At the time of her retirement in 2017, Hayley was the all-time leading women's scorer at the Olympics, with 18 goals, 33 assists and 51 points in 26 games.

In 2011 The Hockey News named Hayley as one of the "Top 100 Most Influential People in Hockey". She continues to be a strong role model for females and young women in hockey.

Congratulations Hayley on a well-deserved induction into the Hockey Hall of Fame.

ROWAN'S LAW DAY

The last Wednesday of each September has been designated as Rowan's Law Day to help raise awareness about concussion safety. Please join us in remembering Rowan Stringer by promoting concussion safety through a tweet, Facebook or Instagram post each year. Rowan's Lad Day was celebrated on September 30, 2020. We hope that you remembered to show your support for #RowansLawDay by sharing your stories and learning the signs and symptoms of a concussion.

Rowan Stringer was a 17-year-old Ottawa varsity rugby player who died from sustaining multiple concussions resulting in a catastrophic swelling of the brain – second impact syndrome. Rowan had three head injuries within 6 days while playing rugby. She was concussed and did not know it. Her parents, teachers and coaches did not know that she was concussed. No one knew, including Rowan that her brain needed time to heal. Rowan's Law and Rowan's Law Day was established to honor her memory and bring awareness to concussions and concussion safety.

The 2019/2020 season was an historic occasion as, effective on Friday, March 13, 2020, all sanctioned hockey in Canada was cancelled due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The cancellation was immediate with events such as the USports Women's Hockey Championship already underway in PEI. On-ice participation was immediately stopped, and plans put in place to get people home. The logistical and financial challenges for everyone in hockey began as plans were changed, refunds were sought, and losses were managed.

OWHA games, playoffs, tournaments and provincial championships were put on hold and eventually cancelled. As with every aspect of business and society, OWHA and its Members worked diligently to plan through the unexpected closures with vast operational and financial implications. Throughout it all, people came together with the same values and teamwork that exemplifies women's hockey and sport. The number 1 priority was, and remains, the health and safety of every individual.

We truly recognize the hurt the cancellation created as participants had no opportunity to come together to wrap up a season with their teammates who had become close friends. Teams were no longer able to move forward to compete in playoffs and provincials in the spots they had worked hard to earn. Associations had to cancel tournaments that are so important for both the opportunities for participants and for the financial stability they bring to the organizations.

We had now joined forces with people throughout the world as we were truly in this together. Although we could not change where we were, we could choose our attitude and our actions in this new reality. The OWHA, its members and its players came together with a positive determination for health and safety at the forefront. We cared about our families and about each other and everyone worked together to close down the hockey season while looking forward to some safe return to hockey.

Fortunately, there were some wonderful success stories throughout the shortened 2019/20 hockey season.

OWHA was well represented at the 2019 U18 National Championship in Manitoba. Team OWHA Red went through the event undefeated, capturing the gold medals. This was the 13^{th} straight gold medal victory for the OWHA at the National Championship that has featured outstanding talent from across the country. Sincere congratulations to all participants on Team OWHA Red and also to the players and staff on Team OWHA Blue as they advanced to the medal round undefeated in their pool and finishing 4^{th} losing a very close bronze medal game to Quebec.

Congratulations to Team Canada on capturing the silver medals at the IIHF U18 World Championship in Bratislava. We also congratulate the players and staff who were selected for Team Canada for the 2020 IIHF Women's World Championship in Halifax and Truro March 31st to April 6th, 2020. Unfortunately, due to the pandemic, the 2020 event was cancelled with the 2021 World Championship being awarded to Halifax and Truro.

The Global Game was, once again, an overwhelming success and is another example of Female Hockey uniting the world in teamwork, building on positive values and cooperation. We thank Hockey Newfoundland and Labrador for hosting the Canada segment and welcoming our OWHA players. Unfortunately, only 5 of the 6 players made it to St. John's due to a major snow storm.

We congratulate all teams on qualifying for the provincial championships. Although the event did not take place, participant hats were sent to those who had qualified. In addition, in the true spirit of sport, one championship hat was sent to every team that had qualified as a gesture that each team was a champion.

The winner of the Midget AA OWHA Provincial Championship was to attend the Esso Cup, National Female Midget Championship scheduled for April in Prince Albert, Saskatchewan but it was also cancelled due to the pandemic.

There was a lot of disappointment with the loss of the CWHL but with the strength of the leadership of the incredible elite players from Canada, the United States and other countries, the PWHPA (Professional Women's Hockey Players Association) formed with the support of Billy Jean King as well as individual and corporate supporters. There is a strong Board of Directors and Jayna Hefford is the Operations Consultant. The players are committed to maximizing opportunities available today and making Female Hockey more respected and stronger for future generations.

We sincerely thank the incredible medical workers and other front-line workers in our membership for the commitment to the health and safety of people as they face personal risks through their incredible efforts. No words are strong enough to express our gratitude.

Special thanks to Minister Lisa MacLeod and the Ministry of Heritage, Sport, Tourism and Culture Industries for the leadership and commitment to sport and for the valuable support of the OWHA. Thanks to Steve Harlow, Patricia Vena and Scott Cooper for their guidance.

Our thoughts and support are with those who have lost loved ones and to those who are struggling with physical and mental challenges due to Covid-19 and other circumstances.

We sincerely thank the volunteers, administrators, sponsors and supporters of each player, team and association. Congratulations and thank you to players of all ages in all parts of Ontario who have faced, with both disappointment and courage, the unexpected change to hockey and to life that we have had to face with the Covid-19 pandemic. We will get through this together with strength and teamwork.

DISCIPLINE REPORT: 2019-2020



NOVICE

There were was a total of 3 suspensions issued at the Novice Level. Novice C had 1 and Novice HL had 2. Of the 3 suspensions issued in the Novice division, 2 were issued to Coaching staff.

ATOM

There were 29 suspensions at the Atom Level. This is a decrease* in the number of suspensions from last year. Both the Atom AA and A levels received the most suspensions with 9 each. This represents 31% in each division of the Atom suspensions. This was followed by Atom B with 5, Atom BB with 1, Atom C with 2 and Atom HL with 3. Two minute check from behind (GM55) was the most frequently called suspension with 7 or 24% of all Atom suspensions. The next highest suspension, disputing a call (GM20-Disputing officials calls), accounted for 6 or 21% of the total suspensions. Coaches received 15 of the 29 suspensions at the Atom level which represents 52% of all Atom level suspensions. Coaches at the Atom A and B levels received the most suspensions with 4 each or 14% in each division. Coaches in the Atom AA level were close behind, receiving 3 or 10% of the suspensions in this division.

PEEWEE

There were 97 suspensions at the Peewee level. This number has decrease* from the previous season. The Peewee A division received the most suspensions at 32 or 33%. Peewee BB was the next highest with 18 or 19% of the total suspensions issued. Peewee AA was at 14, while Peewee B was at 15. Peewee House League had 15 suspensions or 15%, while Peewee C had 3 or 3% of the total suspensions. Checking from Behind (GM55) was the highest suspension called with 20 or 21%. Peewee AA received the most (GM55) calls, with 5 or 6% of the total calls issued. Peewee A, BB and B each had 4 GM55 calls. Disputing officials call (GM21-verbal abuse of an official) was the next highest suspension called with 14 or 14%. Coaches received 34 or 35% of all suspensions at the Peewee level. The coaches at the Peewee A and HL levels received the most suspensions with Peewee A at 11 or 11%, and Peewee HL at 8 or 8% of all coaching suspensions.

BANTAM

There were 293 suspensions at the Bantam level. This represents a 11% decrease* in the number of suspensions received last year. The Bantam B level received the most with 74 suspensions or 25% of all Bantam suspensions. The suspension called most often was Checking from Behind (GM55) with 59 suspensions or 20%. The Bantam A level received the most of these types of suspensions with 19, followed by the Bantam AA level with 15. The next highest suspension called was Disputing officials call (GM20) with 44 suspensions. The Bantam BB level received the most of these types of suspensions with 16. Coaches received 83 or 28% of all suspensions at the Bantam level. The Bantam B level coaches received the most suspensions with 26 or 9% of all coaching suspensions at this level. Players in the Bantam level received 210 or 72% of the suspensions issued.

MIDGET

There were 519 suspensions at the Midget level. This represents a 12% decrease* in the number of suspensions received last year. The Midget A and B levels received the highest number of suspensions with 133 and 100 respectively which represents 26% and 19% of all Midget suspensions. Checking from Behind (GM55) was the suspension called most often with 98 or 19% of all Midget suspensions. The Midget A and B levels received the most of these types of suspensions with 23 and 20 suspensions. The next highest suspension called was Disputing officials call (GM20) with 54 suspensions or 10%. The Midget A level received the most of these suspensions with 18. Coaches received 107 or 21% of all suspensions at the Midget level. The levels where the coaches received the most suspensions were Midget A at 30 or 28% and Midget B with 23 or 21%, Midget AA with 16 or 15% and Midget BB and HL with 15 or 14% each.

INTERMEDIATE

The Intermediate Level received 117 suspensions. This represents a 11% decrease* in the number of suspensions received this year. The Intermediate AA level received the most suspensions with 50 or 43% of all Intermediate suspensions. The Intermediate HL level received the next highest number of suspensions with 38 or 32%. Checking from Behind (GM55) was called most often at the Intermediate level with 18 or 15%. The Intermediate AA level received the most of these types of suspensions with 11 or 9% of all Checking from Behind suspensions. The next highest suspension called was Disputing official call (GM20) with 9 or 8%.

SENIOR

There were 49 Senior level suspensions. The Senior B received the most suspensions with 14, Senior A with 10 and both Senior BB and HL both received 8. While the suspensions were spread out amongst a number of different types, disputing official call (GM21- verbal abuse of official) was called 10 times. Coaches received 8 suspensions, with the Senior C level Coaches receiving the most with 4.

Overall this year there were 1107 suspensions called. This represents an 17% decrease* over last year where 1330 suspensions were called.

The suspension called most often was Checking from Behind (GM55) with 207 which represents 19% of all suspensions called. The Midget level received the most Checking from Behind suspensions with 98 or 47% of these types of suspensions. The next highest suspension called was Disputing a Call (GM20) with 128 or 12%. Both the Bantam and Midget Levels received the most GM20 suspension calls with 44 in the Bantam division and 54 in the Midget division. Together these two divisions total 98 or 9% of the suspensions for this season.

Again this year, the Midget category received the highest number of suspensions with 519 of the 1107 or 47% of all suspensions. The next highest category receiving suspensions was Bantam with 293 suspensions or 26%. The Midget A level received the highest number of suspensions with 133 or 12% of all suspensions. This was followed closely by the Midget B at 100, Midget AA and BB level with 90 each , Midget HL at 55, and Midget C at 49.

Coaching staff received 270 or 24% of all suspensions. The Midget level coaches again received the most with 107 or 39% of all Coach suspensions. Coaches at the Bantam level were next highest with 83 or 31% of the suspensions.

*please note that due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the number of games played for this season were less when compared to other season.

This year there were 59 repeat offenders for the season.

There were 9 staff members and 50 players who were repeat offenders.
