



One Season Information for upcoming 2025 Season

Winnipeg Phoenix Football Club (WPFC) was formed in 2003 and is a Canada Soccer Certified Quality Soccer Provider (SQS-QSP) that provides quality soccer programming for youths ages 4-17.

a. Standards for Quality Soccer (SQS) - designed to outline the minimum expectations of member organizations in Canada. It is expected that all member organizations provide a developmentally appropriate, safe, enjoyable, accessible, inclusive and welcoming playing environment for them participants, which differentiates it from non-member soccer and unorganized play

b. Quality Soccer Provider (QSP) – Members must be in good standing with their governing organization(s) and meet the expectations of membership.

- Assessment evaluations start January 4th, 2025, and end January 16th, 2025, with the possibility of additional sessions based on technical requirements.
- Players will have two (2) assessments for a cost of \$30, held at WSF North and Gateway Rec Centre
- Winnipeg Phoenix FC staff will run the assessments and evaluate the players
- Team formations will begin once the assessments are completed
 - Players that are selected will receive an email and will be asked to register within five days.
 After five days, your placement is not guaranteed.
- Teams will start pre-season training once the assessments are complete and teams are formed
- Players for 2025 season will receive two uniform kits (which includes home & away jerseys, shorts and socks) for the season to be returned to WPFC at the end of the season
- Winnipeg Phoenix FC club teams will train twice a week indoors during pre-season then move outdoors in April (weather permitting). Teams move back indoors in October (weather permitting) to finish the season
- Outdoor training sessions and most home league games will be at Anderson Park 900 Raleigh St.
- League games will start on March 22nd, and end on October 19th.
- WYSA has full control and management of the league schedule

Team Travel U13-U17

Winnipeg Phoenix FC club team travel for players aged U13 to U17 is an important component of youth development in the sport. This practice goes beyond the confines of the field, providing young athletes with a countless experience that contribute to their personal and athletic growth.

Traveling together as a team fosters a sense of camaraderie and unity among players. Spending extended periods together encourages teamwork, communication, and the development of strong bonds that contribute to improved on-field performance. The shared experiences and challenges faced during travel create a unique team dynamic that translates into better cohesion during matches.

Participating in tournaments or matches in different locations exposes the players to a higher level of competition. Facing diverse opponents challenges players to adapt their strategies, refine their skills, and elevate their game. This exposure to varying playing styles and tactics contributes to a well-rounded soccer education and prepares players for the next level of competition.

Traveling away from home for soccer events instills a sense of independence and self-reliance in young players. Negotiating unfamiliar environments, making decisions, and managing their time away from family contribute to the development of resilience, adaptability, and a strong sense of responsibility.

Team travel provides a platform for players to showcase their skills to scouts and talent identification programs. Tournaments and matches attended by scouts offer U13 to U17 players the opportunity to be noticed, potentially opening doors to higher levels of competition and opportunities in the future.

Winnipeg Phoenix FC team travel program is a pivotal aspect of the holistic development of our players. Beyond honing their soccer skills, it shapes them into well-rounded individuals, fostering cultural awareness, teamwork, independence, and resilience.
