Players Code of Conduct

All Winnipeg South AAA players will govern themselves according to the following code of conduct:

- Players are committed to the team for the entire season and the duration of the playoffs and provincials.
- Players will have the appropriate uniform & equipment.
- Players will arrive on time and prepared to all games and practices.
- Players will follow the coaches' instructions and give their best effort at all games and practices.
- Players will contact their coaches if they are unable to attend games or practices and advise them with as much notice as possible.
- Players will respect teammates, coaches, game officials, opponents, parents, and facilities, and conduct themselves as responsible individuals.
- Players will support the team in a positive and encouraging manner.
- Players will not demonstrate or encourage physical or verbal abuse toward coaches, teammates, umpires, opponents, or spectators
- Players will not argue balls, strikes, or other any other judgment calls. Players acknowledge that
 the Coaches are the designated team representatives and they will be the only ones to address
 any issues with the umpire
- Players who address a question or concern to the coach will do so in a respectful manner and at an appropriate time.
- Players are responsible for their own personal property. The team is not responsible for lost or stolen personal property.
- Players are fully expected to succeed along their educational path. Baseball is a reward for achieving success in school.
- Players are expected to remember that it is a privilege to play the game of baseball and to be a member of Winnipeg South AAA.
- Players will abide by all policies as set forth in the current edition of WSMBA AAA Handbook.
- Players agree to abide by all Park Policies as posted at Charleswood Place.

Parents Code of Conduct

All Winnipeg South AAA parents and spectators will govern themselves according to the following code of conduct:

- Parents are responsible for transportation to and from practices and games (for those players who do not have a driver's license).
- Parents will ensure their player has proper equipment and is prepared for practices and games.
- Parents will ensure coaches are notified about player absences in a timely manner.
- Parents will not argue balls, strikes, or other any other judgment calls. They acknowledge that
 the Coaches are the designated team representatives and that Coaches will be the only ones to
 address any issues with the umpire
- Parents will respect the coaches, players, opponents, officials, and program administrators.
- Parents will not ridicule, embarrass, demean, or abuse any player, spectator, official, opponent.
- Parents must respect the player/team selection, even if they do not agree with it.
- Parents must respect the team rules and discipline standards as stated by the coach.
- Parents must respect all decisions made by the coach, even if they do not agree with them.
- Parents must remember that their child plays for his or her own enjoyment, not theirs.
- Parents will remember that children learn best by example.
- Parents will show respect for the opposing team, because without them there would be no game or competition.
- Parents should not have unrealistic expectations. They should remember that child athletes are not miniature professionals and cannot be judged by professional standards.
- Parents with a concern that needs to be addressed with a coaching staff member will wait at least 24 hours after the concern arises.
- Parents will not approach a coach with a suggestion or concern less than one hour before or after a game or practice.
- Parents will not approach the dugout at any time and will respect it as a place for the players and coaches only.
- Parents will address the coach/parent representative in private, in a calm/respectful manner.
- Parents will make every effort to complete their volunteer hours during the season and report them to the team manager. It is the parent's responsibility to report hours worked. The volunteer bond will not be prorated; families who work less than 15 hours forfeit the bond.
- Parents will abide by all policies as set forth in the current edition of WSMBA AAA Handbook.
- Parents agree to abide by all Park Policies as posted at Charleswood Place.

Coaches Code of Conduct

All Winnipeg South AAA coaches will govern themselves according to the following code of conduct:

- Coaches are committed to the team for the entire season and the duration of the playoffs and provincials.
- Coaches will arrive on time and prepared to all games and practices.
- Coaches will address the umpires with respect
- Coaches will treat each player fairly
- Coaches will adhere to the Fair Play Policy as outlined in the AAA Handbook.
- Coaches will respect the players, parents, opponents, officials, and program administrators.
- Coaches will not ridicule, embarrass, demean, or abuse any player, spectator, official, or opponent.
- Coaches will refrain from use of profanity, insulting, harassing or otherwise offensive language.
- Coaches will not be under the influence of drugs or alcohol prior to a game and will not consume alcohol after a game, while still at the diamond.
- Coaches will respect any academic commitments players have and ensure that their activities permit them to pursue academic success.
- Coaches will show respect for the opposing team, because without them there would be no game or competition.
- Coaches will cooperate in Criminal Record Checks and Child Abuse Registry Checks.
- Coaches will ensure that any activity being undertaken is suitable for the age, experience, ability and fitness level of the players.
- Coaches will consider the future health and well-being as foremost when making decisions regarding an injured player's ability to continue training or competing.
- Coaches will respect the rules and regulations of Baseball Manitoba, WABA, and all other organizations which game play may be regulated under.
- Coaches will respect the property of the association at all time and make every attempt to prevent damage of said property.
- Coaches will regularly seek ways of increasing personal development and ensure their coaching certification is current.
- Coaches will wear their official jersey with pride and project a favorable image of WSMBA.
- Coaches will abide by all policies as set forth in the current edition of WSMBA AAA Handbook.
- Coaches agree to abide by all Park Policies as posted at Charleswood Place.
