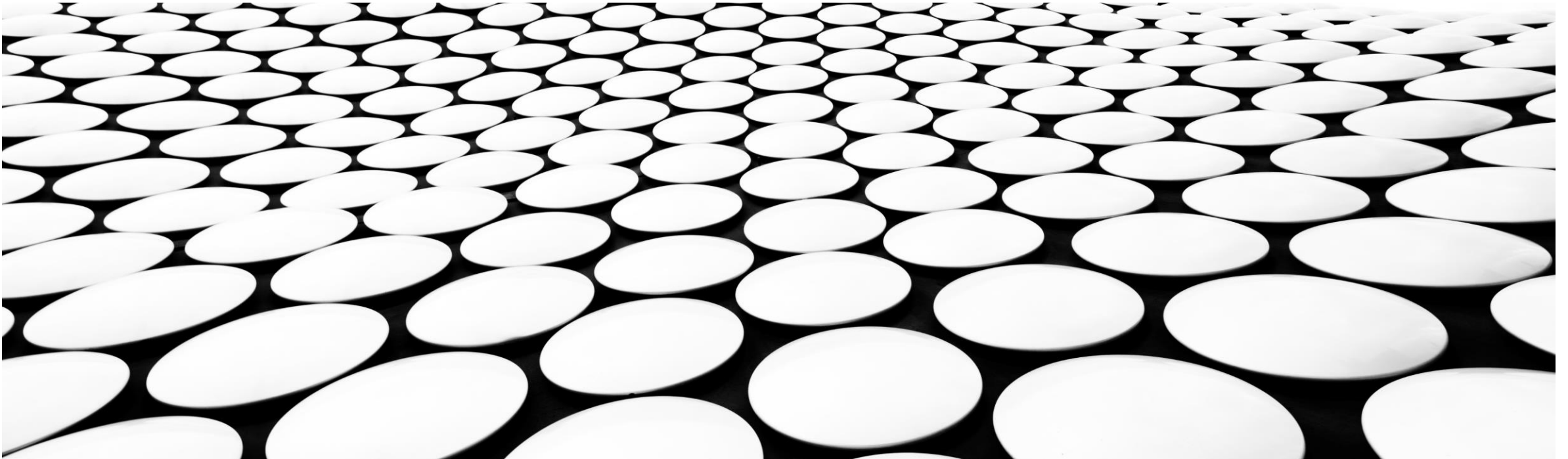

# ROLE OF THE HEALTH AND SAFETY COORDINATOR

- Ensure physical distancing (2m)
- Discourage equipment sharing, if sharing occurs equipment has to be sanitized
- Disinfect baseballs and bases
- Ensure players hand sanitize frequently
- Record attendance every game and practice, must keep record for 21 days
- Signage-ensure proper signage is displayed
- Self screening-ensure each player has self screened every practice/game
- Need hand sanitizer and disinfecting supplies for their team(each association will decide purchase details)
- Attend every game and practice, if unable to attend make sure someone will assume your role for you

# THINGS TO NOTE

- Anyone displaying symptoms of illness will not be allowed to participate, anyone in contact with someone who is sick can not participate
- No team huddles without physical distancing (2m)
- Uniforms must be washed after every event
- Participants are encouraged to shower after every event
- Each player needs multiple masks and hand sanitizer in their bag, masks must be two layers or more, gaiters are allowed-need to be folded in half to make two layers
- Players are to line up ball bags along fence outside of dugout
- No shaking hands or high fives
- Spectators cannot touch bases or baseballs
- Only 1 team can practice at a time (except for Rally cap and Grand Slam, which allows 2 or 3 teams at a time)
- Umps and/or Coaches will not start games/practices until certain that protocols are being implemented
- **Regulations currently allow 1 spectator per player** (outdoor training must be conducted in groups of 50 or less)
- Players, coaches, managers and Health and Safety Co-ordinators are included in the 50 participants group and do not count towards the 1 spectator rule
- No spitting/chewing gum/sunflower seeds (Posters in PDF form in Return to Play documents), no saliva on hands
- Coaches and players wear masks when unable to physically distance

## IMPORTANT DETAILS

- All required signage/attendance sheet is on the Baseball Manitoba website under the “Return to Play” tab in the top right corner of the home page
- All Health and Safety Co-ordinator’s names and email addresses need to be sent to me morgansecd@gmail.com ASAP
- Jason Miller (Baseball Manitoba Executive Director) will hold a Zoom meeting with all Co-ordinators
- Health and Safety officials will be checking diamonds to ensure we are following proper protocols, so we require more diligence this year to ensure our kids can play ball
- Health and Safety Co-ordinators have to be entered into RAMP
