

Andy Cameron is the full-time Technical Director at WCRFC. After 25 years of working with different soccer groups across the country, Andy, a "soccer lifer" is back on PEI working with Winsloe Charlottetown Royals FC players and coaches as the club's full-time Technical Director. Andy was born in Halifax, but raised on the South Shore of Nova Scotia and moved to PEI when he was 12 years old. He grew up playing soccer in the Charlottetown area, playing with the Colonel Gray Colonels and starring with the UPEI Panthers in their glory days of the mid 80's. During this time, he was also a member of the National Team Olympic Program.

Andy started his coaching career with the UPEI Panthers in the late 80's and has had University coaching stints with Memorial University, University of New Brunswick, and the University of North British Columbia. He has also coached Canada Games teams in 3 different provinces and has been on the coaching staff of various National Teams over the years.

Most recently Andy was the Technical Director for the South Shore District Soccer Association of Nova Scotia, where he oversaw the development of players and coaches for ten soccer clubs in the district. WCRFC is very excited to be able to bring Andy on as a full time Technical Director. "Being able to hire someone with Andy's soccer knowledge and experience to work with our club is an amazing opportunity." says Peter Howatt, president of WCRFC.
