In October, we hosted an education seminar for all U12 and younger Regional coaches "How to get the most out of your Skills Matrix". This session was designed to help coaches use the information learned about their players and team during the skills matrix and build practice plans to support that development. We shared ideas and drills and worked together to develop season plans.

Special congratulations go out to the St Mary's and Chatham Associations that had coaches attend. Their feedback was very positive and both associations felt that their coaches benefited from this information. It was extremely disappointing that NO other association sent coaches to this event. Grass Roots development is an essential part of the growth of Ringette and this seminar was designed to help support this initiative.

Moving forward, this will be a mandatory session for all Regional coaches U14 and under.

The second set of skills matrix assessments are due by March 31st 2017. Failure to submit will result in an association fine of \$500. No extensions will be given to any association. Please make sure these assessments are completed and submitted prior to March 31st 2017.

Fair Ice Policy

Just a reminder that the Fair Ice policy impacts ALL teams not just regional teams. I have attached a copy of the policy as a reminder for all and ask that all associations share this with your coaches again.

The Fair Ice Policy covers not only fair ice time, but also includes things like;

- Rotation of starting lines
- Rotations of goalies
- Rotation of players in key situations
- Rotation of players through positions (U8, U9 and U10)

The Fair Ice Policy is designed to help all players at all levels have the opportunity to develop skills.

In Western Region we have already verbally warned 4 coaches from 4 different associations at a variety of age groups. A written warning is the next step in the process and is attached permanently to your coaching record.
