The first Ontario Adult Invitational Cup (OAIC) was held in Mississauga March 30 to April 1/2012. 20 with teams from Western, Southern and Central participating at 18+BB, B and C levels. As stated the overall success will be reviewed at the SCM. The OAIC was held at the same time as WRRA and SWWR Regionals as Mississauga had ice available to run the OAIC.

The OAIC was designed to be an all adult tournament and run by ADP without G&T. The was some confusion. Other items to review are looking for a host for next year, attempt to find a non-conflicting weekend and attempt to entice more teams to participate.

### Western Regionals

11 18+ teams participated in the Western Regionals at the B and BB levels the Woolwich Bees and Guelph Gold winning respectively.

# Level of Play and Seeding

This was ADP's first attempt to review and compare levels of play amongst ALL regions. This was done by comparing tournament results and league play. This resulted in one team Western and Southern teams moved up C to B.

In order though to maintain "balanced" divisions amongst adult team throughout the province, ADP is again asking that ALL Open teams honestly appraise their own abilities and to register and play at the appropriate level.

### Masters Level 30+

Reminder to those teams that qualify to consider registering a Masters team. There are some benefits to registering as a Masters team (see the ADP manual). Masters teams may play at their Level of Play (i.e. B,C, etc) in a non Masters level division of a tournament and continue to use the benefits of Masters. Underaged substitutions void all Masters benefits
